Grooming Tips for Berner Owners

According to the Bernese Mountain Dog Handbook, published by the Bernese Mountain Dog Club of America by the Publications Committee in 1994 and 2009 ...

"The coat is of the Bernese Mountain Dog is thick, moderately long and slightly wavy or straight. It has a bright natural sheen. Extremely curly or extremely dull-looking coats are undesirable. The Bernese Mountain Dog is shown in natural coat and undue trimming is to be discouraged."


Our job, as owners, is to keep their coats beautiful by occasional bathing, brushing and overall grooming. Their feet and nails should be neatly trimmed. It is also important to


clean their ears regularly to avoid possible infections. Good dental hygiene is essential to your Berner's overall health. Berners' natural coats add to their stunning appearance. Your Berners are not Poodles ... therefore, unnecessary sculpting or trimming should not be performed. Remember that grooming should be a fun experience for both you and your dog!

- Brushing Your Berner Use the proper tools. A slicker brush is used for general brushing. A rake comb is used for detangling and combing out any matted fur. Scissors may be required to cut out severely matter fur. Routine brushing several times a week helps to keep the shedding under control. The rake comb is used to help remove mats in the undercoat. Use the rake gently, so that you do not hurt your Berner. Proper brushing with the slicker brush helps to distribute the healthy skin oils through your dog's coat.
- Bathing Your Berner Bath your Berner only occasionally. A Berner's coat sheds dirt very easily. Too frequent bathing can dry out their skin. ALWAYS brush your dog thoroughly prior to bathing. Once wet, matts are impossible to remove safely. Make sure you have a non-slip mat when bathing your Berner to protect he/she from slips or falls. A hair catcher over your drain is highly

recommended. Be sure to bathe with lukewarm water. Wet your dog completely prior to applying shampoo. Then work the shampoo all the way down to the skin, Speak gently and lovingly to your Berner during the bath. Most Berners do not like water on their face, so use a moistened cloth and use caution around their eyes.

• **Drying Your Berner** - Use a **doggie hair dryer** for best results. They are more powerful and the temperature can be controlled more easily. It's critical to completely dry the coat. Since they have a double coat, it is important to dry the undercoat as well. A damp coat will provide the perfect environment for a hot spot to develop. If you start young, your Berner will learn to love the attention while blow drying their coat.









Grooming Tips (Cont'd.)

- Cleaning and Drying Your Berner's Ears Moisture in the ear canal can cause ear infections. Dry the ears with a clean cotton swab. Using an Ear Relief Wash, such as Vet's Best is recommended. It is important that there are no Parabens, Dyes, or Alcohol in the ear wash. Moisten the cotton swab and using your index finger reach into your dog's ear to remove any buildup of dirt or wax. Then, use a dry swab to ensure both ears are dry.
- Brushing Your Berner's Teeth This can be a bit tricky. Brush your dog's teeth a couple of times per week. Pick up a dog safe toothbrush or finger brush and a tube of doggie toothpaste. Beef or liver flavored seem to taste best to the dog. Start slow and rub your dog's teeth with your finger. Then touch the toothbrush to each tooth. Next put some toothpaste on your finger and let your dog lick it off. After the dog is comfortable, gently brush their teeth. Start at the front and work to the back teeth. Praise your dog along the way.
- Caring for Your Berner's Feet and Nails Trim your dog's nails about once a month. Since most Berners have dark nails, you must trim slowly being careful not to hit the quick. The quick is a pink vein that runs through the nail. You will notice the white spot in the center of the nail. As it starts to darken, you are getting closer to the quick, so be very careful. It is good to have styptic powder on hand just in case you get too close to the quick and it starts to bleed. You can use a guillotine or scissor type trimmer or a doggie dremel tool. Use an emery board to smooth any rough edges, so your dog will not split any nails. Use small scissors to trim the hair around the nails, between the toes, and under the paws. Trim flat against the surface of the paw pads to avoid injuring their pads. Pull the hair up between their toes to trim between their toes.




