AKC Canine Good Citizen Workshop - 5/10/25



The workshop instructor was Beth McGonigal, CBCC-KA, CPDT-KA, ABCDT. Beth is the Owner and Head Trainer of North Pittsburgh Animal Behavior located in Gibsonia, PA. Beth is an AKC CGC Certified Evaluator and will be administering the CGC Test for the Club on September 13th at Harrison Hills Park.

AKC Canine Good Citizen Test Criteria

TRBMDC will be hosting a AKC Canine Good Citizen Test on Saturday, September 13 at Harrison Hills Park - Wake-Robin Pavilion (1:00 p.m.). Beth McGonigal, CBCC-KA, CPDT-KA, ABCDT will be the evaluator. She was our instructor for the workshop that we just held. So you have three months to practice up and prepare your Berner for the CGC Test. Dogs who pass this test and receive their AKC CGC Title will be included in our 2025 Awards Celebration. So start practicing these 10 evaluation criteria.



Canine Good Citizen Test Items

Accepting a friendly stranger

Evaluator approaches and pretends to shake hands with handler (hands 6- 12" apart). Evaluator does not touch dog.

2. Sitting politely for petting

Evaluator pets dog; dog must show no shyness or resentment.

3. Appearance and grooming

Evaluator inspects dog, combs or brushes lightly, examines ears and each front foot.

4. Out for a walk

Handler takes dog for a short walk including right turn, left turn, about turn and stop.

5. Walking through a crowd

Dog and handler walk close to several people; dog may show causal interest but not jump up.

6. Sit and down on cue/Staying in place

Handler shows that dog can do both sit and down, then chooses a position, leaves dog and goes to the end of a 20 ft. line, and returns immediately.

7. Coming when called

With dog still on 20 ft. line from Test 6, handler walks out 10 ft. and calls the dog.

8. Reaction to another dog

Two handlers and dogs approach, pretend to shake hands (hands 6-12" apart), exchange pleasantries, then move on.

9. Reaction to distractions

Distractions are presented; dog may not panic or show aggression.

10. Supervised separation

Handler goes out of sight for 3-min. Dog is held on a 6-ft. leash by an evaluator.



The 2025 BMDCA National Specialty in Gettysburg, PA was the 50th Anniversary and what a celebration it was! It was spectacular to see how truly stunning and versatile our Working Breed is.

- There were Berners competing in Conformation for several days leading up to the Best of Breed competition on the last day. The quality of the judging was exceptional and the entries were evaluated against the Bernese Mountain Dog Standard. There were Berners and judges from the all over the United States, as well as many other countries. The Berners were simply beautiful! With good breeding practices, including health testing and research, the BMDCA is determined to uphold our pure breed standard for years to come.
- Herding, Agility, Drafting, Obedience, Rally Obedience, Farm Dog, and Scent Work were only some of the
 Trials and Tests that the Berners participated in. Watching our Berners in their areas of expertise was
 amazing. And behind each and every Berner is a devoted owner spending countless hours to train them.
- Berner University provided a variety of state-of-the-art, educational programs for participants to expand their knowledge of the breed.
- One of my all time favorite events is the heart-warming, Veterans Parade. Owners and their Berners strutted their stuff going around the ring to thunderous applause. And as we got to the older veterans, the pace slowed down ... and it became very emotional. One of my favorites was Brody, who was pulled around the ring by his owner, Liz, on his decorated, four-wheeled platform.
- Of course the Pee Wee Attraction, was a crowd pleaser. Small toddlers and young children took their stuffed Berners or real ones around the ring. Perhaps a future BOB owner was toddling around the ring!
- Again this year, Berner-Garde was well represented and holding several tests in hopes to continue research
 to detect and eliminate dreaded Berner diseases. Many of us contributed urine samples or bloodwork to
 support their ongoing research. In addition, a Health Auction was held to raise funds for health.
- A large display of Rescued Berners shared heartfelt stories of Rescue efforts and success stories. Our Club featured "Beau" (previously Benjamin Buttons), who blessed us with his attendance at the show.
- The Annual Specialty Raffle raised close to \$10,000 to assist in future BMDCA endeavors. Plus nightly, social events were held and allowed many of us to socialize with other Berner lovers and friends.



A True "Tail" of Hope

Vicki Thomas of Tails of Hope Animal Rescue of Harrison City, PA was picking up breeding mommas that a 'breeder' wasn't needing anymore. Vicki normally specializes in helping smaller breeds due to her own smaller stature. Vicki walked by a Berner puppy in a small crate and found that he was to be destroyed due to being unsellable! Vicki brought him home and fostered herself. Giving him the best care possible and a chance at life. Beau at 8 weeks, rear gait was not right ... he didn't move his tail. Also he didn't seem to know when he was pooping and possibly incontinent of urine. Vicki found that Beau had Spina Bifida. She also had the best Doctors and Therapist caring for him. They were hoping to get some tail movement and bowel control. Unfortunately, his tail remained "dead"; and it was in his best interest to have it amputated for cleanliness. Beau can run, go upstairs and acts like any other puppy his age. He may have the ultimate sloppy sit and "bumble rear gait"; but he doesn't know he is different and is not in any discomfort. The "breeder' deemed him unsellable, but he was still deserving of the same unconditional love he gives. Vicki fell in love with the breed, a true ambassador with his wonderful Berner self. Not just one, but two people offered to give this boy a loving home. Both homes had previous experience of giving senior/special needs dogs the love they deserve. A Special Thank You to Terri McDermott of National Bernese Rescue Network in helping find Kathy ... who now is enjoying all that love. Beau may never have full control of his bowel and bladder. It really takes a special person to give that kind of commitment. Hopefully you will run into Beau and Kathy at the Specialty. If so, give Kathy an extra Thank you and a hug for Beau.

A Quote from Kathy, Beau's new owner.

"Vicki was there to pick up other dogs, noticed him, asked about him, and chose to take on an additional dog - whose issues were unknown. That meant finding a place for him, getting him vetted, checking out specialists, and doing whatever was needed to help him. None of that was planned. That is the true meaning of "rescue", and while I'm so glad he's with me and happy to play my part, he wouldn't be with us if it weren't for Vicki."

This took a consorted effort, mostly by Vicki and Tails of Hope with a little help from Three Rivers Bernese Club Rescue (networking and fundraising), and National Bernese Rescue Network. The best ending is Vicki most likely has been able to pull Beau's Mom from the 'breeder'. She is in foster care through Tails of Hope with Three Rivers Bernese Club helping. Small Breed groups can still make an impact on the lives of Berners in need. This was the best partnership with a local rescue.

Dante was a magnificent dog. He was my fourth Bernese Mountain dog. Therefore, I don't use the word magnificent lightly. My journey with the beloved breed started over 30 years ago in 1994 with Socrates from Dr. Mary Dawson, the first president of the Bernese Mountain Dog Club of America and my friend and teacher of the breed.

Dante was named after the Italian poet, writer, and philosopher. Gelbackler was Bev Cechman's, Dante's breeder kennel name meaning yellow cheeks. The last part of his name is after the Apennine Mountain range that runs from the Alps through Florence, Italy, where the Italian poet Dante is from.

When Bev gave me Dante, she pushed him into my arms with tears in her eyes and said to me, "I hope he lives a long time." Well, Bev, Dante did live a long life for a Bernese Mountain Dog - 10+ years. As the Swiss saying goes, "Three years a young dog, three years a good dog, and three years an old dog. Any more years is a gift from God."

Dante was striking, handsome, and a perfectly marked Berner. His black coat and white and rust markings were textbook perfect! He had great bone, impressive paws, a beautiful chest all inherited from his father, Donna Millburn's Bentley, and a wonderful personality. Dante had a dignified and kind head. You could look into his eyes and see the depth of his intelligence. He was the most intelligent Berner I ever owned.


Dante's trademark was always greeting us with a toy in his mouth when we arrived home. Something my son, Rob, taught him. He greeted us with such a big, loving welcome each and every time we came home. Dante was a very good and obedient dog. He rarely got into trouble. Although he was known to "read" a few books, maybe that is why he was so intelligent.

I was the lucky one. Dante chose me as his person. He was protective, devoted, and loving to his entire family, but especially to me & never left my side. We didn't have to worry if the front door was accidentally left open; Dante would never leave our home. He wasn't leaving my side. I can remember having ½ the neighborhood chasing after one of my Berners. Dante loved to eat and then take a nap with my husband, Terry, in bed. Walking, eating, and napping were his three favorite activities.

Dante was kind to all animals, especially the birds and squirrels in my backyard. Squirrels could play within inches of his feet; and he would watch their antics. Dante loved to go for walks, and the deer, snowy egrets, and blue herons would just acknowledge him and go about their business. Dante was a pure pleasure to walk. Once trained, he never pulled me. In the early and middle years, we walked for miles. As he aged, of course, the walks became shorter and shorter. But he would always want to go on a walk, even if it was extremely short. I said goodbye to him with a vet coming to our home. Dante could no longer physically get up and walk. We believe he had Degenerative Myelopathy. Dante passed in my arms at home. I like to think he's in Bev's arms now in heaven until I join him. My heart is breaking and will be for a long time. Dante was my "Mr. Wonderful" his entire life and will forever live in my heart!
