We had a great time at Settlers Cabin in August for the TRBMDC Summer Picnic. There were a couple of puppies at various ages, which was tons of fun. The weather was very nice for August, not too hot! We all had a laugh at the games. We played "Will your dog eat this?", "The sock race", and "Is this your dog". There is nothing funnier than seeing a Berner run in socks. Well maybe watching the owners encouraging their dogs to run in socks! People were pretty good at recognizing their dogs or maybe the blindfold wasn't tight enough?

Fall will soon be upon us; and it will be time for our second K-9 Idol event. This event for our dogs is very similar to a dog show, but the classes are a little different. There will be classes like wiggliest tail, longest tail, dog tricks and even a costume contest. You can enter your dog in one class or all classes for free! You still have time to practice learning a trick or two with your dogs. We hope you will join us on Saturday, October 7 at Northmoreland Park - Pavilion 7 at 1:00 pm.

In the spring and fall tick activity increases, so I did some reading on ticks. I want to avoid those little buggers. Ticks are small parasites that are related to spiders, not bugs (insects). I didn't know that. They are most active in the spring and fall when the adult females need a blood host. Yuck! The females will climb tall grasses or plants in fields or the woods and wait for you or your dog to pass by. Using their front legs, they grab on, hitch a ride, and then feast. Ugh! Once it gets down to 37 degrees, they go dormant. In our area, we are concerned with Lyme disease in both people and dogs. My goal is to lower the risk for both me and Poco. In Pennsylvania, between 40% to 50% of the ticks are infected with Lyme. Ticks go through 4 stages, adult, egg, larva & nymph that becomes an adult and the cycle goes on. Many animals and birds are hosts to ticks. It's the mice that actually transmit the Lyme bacteria to the ticks and then the ticks pass it on. Ticks will lay their eggs in a gooey mass in the host animal's nest, so the eggs can survive on the nest's material. Ticks like warm, grassy, or wooded areas with leaf litter. YIKES! That's where our dogs love to be! It's helpful to keep the grass trimmed and leaves picked up. We sold "tick tubes" at our meetings that can be placed in your yard to kill the ticks on the mice. The tube has cotton balls in it that the mice will take to their nest. There is chemical (permethrin) on the cotton balls that will kill the ticks on the mice or in their nest. They can be placed in flowerbeds, bushes, wood piles, stone walls, and sheds. If you are hiking, wearing light colored clothes, and tucking your pants and shirt in will make the ticks easier to spot. Remove your clothes and wash them in hot water. There are also several creatures that eat ticks. The two who are the best are opossums and Guinee fowl! The opossums eat the ticks like a vacuum cleaner! You will have to check your local residential ordinances to see if you are permitted to have Guinea fowl! I plan to look into it!













Time for Senior Submissions to the BMDCA Alpenhorn
