





Holiday Raffles to Benefit Rescue Programs

Pet Friends, Inc.

Pet Friends Inc. is a small 501 3C animal rescue located in the North Huntingdon/Irwin area that celebrated its 20th anniversary in 2023. The rescue does not have its own physical building, but rents kennel space at Carwen's Grooming & Boarding. Cats are cared for in foster homes in the area. The dogs in care are obtained from area Animal Controls and owner surrenders. The cats in care are surrendered or are rescues from situations from citizens notifying Pet Friends of cats in need and litters of kittens. All dogs and cats ae vaccinated, microchipped, altered, and have any tests completed upon adoption. When volunteers are not caring for animals, they are active in rescue events and fundraising. Fundraising is vital to provide necessary medical care.

After almost 20 years of diligent fundraising, a shelter is becoming a reality. In July of 2022, Pet Friends closed on 4.6 acres in Sewickley Township. A committee has completed plans for a building and we continue fundraising while we wait for several permits to be approved by the state.

Your donations will go directly to the care for the rescued dogs and cats. We will be collecting donations for Pet Friends, Inc. at our December 2 Holiday Party/Bonfire. Please open your hearts and wallets and consider a generous donation to Pet Friends, Inc. this holiday season. We will have a raffle, so bring some extra cash to support this great organization that is making a difference in the lives of rescued pets. 
Celebrating Our 2023 Title Holders

A Forever Home for Hank

Seems like fate that Julia Airgood called me on October 24 and shared that a little Berner puppy was turned into the Humane Animal Rescue (HAR). Luckily, a kind women at the HAR contacted TRBMDC (Julia) to make her aware of the surrender. Since the puppy was so young she did not want him to have to be neutered before adoption, so she turned him over to our Club. Apparently a college student bought the puppy from an Amish breeder in Ohio. Unable to take care of the puppy, he/she drove back to Ohio to try to return it. Of course that didn't work, so "Hank" was turned over to HAR. Unfortunately due to personal reasons Julia was unable to pick him, so she contacted me.

HAR was ready to close for the day, so John and I went first thing in the morning to pick up Hank. Not sure I ever saw such a little puppy that had already gone through so much. Hank was a measly 12 pounds; and the vet estimated he was 10 weeks old. What a sweet face looking for some love and a forever home. He tested positive for Coccidia ... an intestinal tract infection caused by ingestion of feces or soil infected by microscopic parasites that attach to the lining of the intestines and cause severe diarrhea. Poor Hank! HAR was prescribed medication and administered vaccines and off we went carrying this sweet little boy.



Now what – guess we were fostering for the first time ever? Fearful, that we were going to be foster failures ... we started to care for him and his round-the-clock diarrhea! It did not take long for Hank's sweet personality to show ... and John was beginning to talk about keeping him. Oh no – we already have an 8-1/2 yr. old Berner and 1 yr. old Puppy! And I was worried about me being the weak link! We invited our best friend neighbors (John, Dana, Grace, JP and Skye Byrnes) over to visit. They lost their sweet lab rescue about a year ago. Of course, they fell in love with Hank too – hard not to! BTW, we also had another family, who previously rescued a Berner from Heart of Michigan, who was looking to rescue a male puppy. Julia (our Club's Rescue Chair) stepped back into the picture to assess. So ... the best outcome ever, Hank moved in next door! We get to see him daily and although he also tested positive for Giardia, he is now doing great. In fact, he even goes to work at the gym that they own in Shadyside. And our Lexi and Rayne will have a new best friend for life! Here's hoping that you will all get to meet Hank soon!

Ticks and the Tick Borne Disease They Bring

Fall is here and the ticks are here to stay! Even though the weather is cooler that doesn't mean the ticks are going away. This article will go over what happens if the ticks do hop onto your pet, attach and transmit the tick borne disease.

Hypothetically after the tick has attached, it can take a the minimum 24 hours to fully engage. There is a test called a 4DX that can test for Lyme Disease, Anaplasma, and Borrelia, which are all tick borne diseases. When the tick attaches and transmits Lyme, it can take 4 to 8 weeks to show a positive test result. When

the Lyme dot shows up on the test, there is a more in-depth test that will put a number on the Lyme. If it was positive and the titer is over 30, your vet may start treatments. If it is under 10, the vet will probably suggest further monitoring for symptoms.

Symptoms to look out for would be pain (especially in jointed areas), a fever, the walking gait seems off, and/or a decreased desire to eat or drink. Unfortunately not all dogs present the same way when it comes to tick borne diseases. It is a good idea to also have dog bloodwork drawn as well, because there is a possibility that the Lyme Disease can start to attack the kidneys. That's call Lyme Nephritis, which is where the Lyme Disease attacks the kidney and shuts them done, This can be reversible. Please talk to your veterinarian, if your pet has Lyme Disease to determine what the next steps would be to ensure all bases are covered.

So with the tick borne disease diagnosis ... what happens now? Your veterinarian will most likely send you home with Doxycycline and a pain medicine, if they are needed.

How do we lower the chances of this happening again? There are so many flea and tick preventatives on the market and not all work like others. Your veterinarian may suggest oral flea and tick over topical flea and tick medication. With the topical route, the ticks have evolved enough that they are not affected by the topical. Oral flea and tick product have been proven to be more effective. If your pet can only tolerate certain flea and tick medications, talk to the veterinarian about which type of prevention is best for them. That being said, please stay away from Heartz and Sergents Skip a Flea. They both have been known to cause topical reactions and possible seizures, even if the correct size was given. There is also a Lyme vaccine to help further a better prevention for your pet. Now you're probably thinking that this is not going to stop Lyme or any tick borne diseases, and you are correct. The thing is that all of those steps help decrease the risk factors of getting Lyme Disease and other tick borne diseases.

In conclusion, ticks don't go away in the fall; and there is always a potential that pets can contract tick borne diseases. Getting them on a preventive and the vaccine lowers their risk. These are ways to treat Tick Borne Diseases, but also monitoring the disease is a good method of keeping an eye on your pets health.
