



## Celebrating Our 2025 Title Holders

It's time to recognize our Berners who have earned titles in 2025. Many of you worked really hard to earn titles this year. This includes the AKC Canine Good Citizen (CGC) title that a few of you recently earned. So don't miss out in giving them the recognition that they truly deserve. "Member" dogs earning their "first" title will receive a wooden plaque with an engraved plate indicating their earned title. Prior title holders need to return the metal plate to have the new title(s) engraved. If the plate is firmly attached to the plaque and you are unable to remove it, you will need to return the whole plaque

- Dog's Registered Name (or exactly how you want the name to read on the plaque)
- Title(s) Earned in 2025 by your Berner(s) - Please provide proof of the title(s) earned
- If your title is not an AKC title, please provide the initials of your title to be shown on the plaque, as well as proof of the title(s) earned
- If this is the first title earned by your Berner, please advise, so that a plaque can be ordered
- Owner's Name
- Owner's Phone Number



Shown below are the TRBMDC Award Guidelines:

1. TRBMDC will provide one plaque per dog to Club members, in good standing, when the dog earns her/her first official title.
2. When additional titles are earned, the metal plate must be sent back to have the additional title(s) engraved. Plates should be returned to Julia Airgood at 415 Dorseyville Road, Pittsburgh, PA 15215 no later than November 10.
3. The titled dog must live in the household with the Club member.
4. Proof of the title must be submitted.

We are anxious to see how many of our members' dogs have received titles in 2025. The title holders will be announced and receive their plaque or engraved plate at the Holiday Party on December 6.
